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#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

A much better week for us all weather wise, although, Tuesday wasn't great. I do hope that Summer is gradually making its presence felt with warmer days and less rain.

On Tuesday morning we welcomed the new CEO of Sefton Council, Mr Phil Porter and Councillor Diane Roscoe, Cabinet Member for Education. I was delighted that they were able to visit our school and to see it in all its glory with the children engaged in their lessons and showing an extremely positive attitude towards their learning as well as being courteous and polite. They were both most impressed with all that we had to offer our children as this was the first time that they had visited our school. I wanted them to see what we have created together over the years, many of you who are now parents were children at the school and you can see at first hand the developments that we have and continue to make. I wanted our visitors to be aware of the current difficulties that schools like ours are facing with regards to the levels of funding that make it increasingly challenging to maintain what we have worked so hard to provide. I explained that I was finding it almost impossible to continue with all the current provision and support that our children enjoy and that schools like ours that do not receive significant amounts of extra funding are having to consider cutting some of our provision. They listened carefully and commented that they were aware and would try to look for anyways that they could further support our school and others like us. I remain optimistic but at the same time realistic.

Our school council had an extremely positive meeting this week with our junior children sharing some of their thoughts about how we could further improve things within our school. They informed me that many children are bringing sweets and chocolate into school as part of their morning snack. This should be avoided and a healthy option should be sent in for playtime. A number of issues were identified, however, they were all extremely complimentary about the learning environment within each of their classes and the resources that are available to help them in our rich learning curriculum.

The fine weather has once again highlighted the need for names in children's clothing. Children leave hoodies, cardigans and jumpers on the field and in other places. If you could put their initials clearly on the reverse of the school bade and go over it from time to time, this would be a big help. Iron on name tags are even better - see gallery picture.

Competitive sports are well underway and both our boys and girls will be playing football matches this week against St Georges. On Wednesday the Year 5 boys travel to Finch Farm with the Year 2 boys taking part in the Chesterfield High Football Tournament. The older boys finish off the week with a game against Green Park Primary.
